

## **Appendix 2. Proof of very good knowledge of the English language**

During the admission process, applicants must provide evidence of very good knowledge (C1 level) of the English language. The procedure follows the PD 146/2007 [Article 1 "Amendment of provisions of PD 50/2001 Determination of qualifications for appointment to positions of public sector bodies as it applies" (Government Gazette 185/3.8.2007/series A)] in conjunction with PD 116/2006 [Article 1, last paragraph of par.1 "Amendment of article 28 of the PD 50/2001" (Government Gazette 115/9.6.2006/series A)]. According to that, very good knowledge (C1) of the English language is demonstrated by presenting one of the following:

1. Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) of University of Cambridge or of Cambridge Assessment English or Certificate in Advanced English of Cambridge Assessment English overall score 180-199.
2. Certificate of Proficiency in English by Cambridge Assessment English overall score 180-199.
3. First Certificate in English of Cambridge Assessment English overall score 180-190.
4. Bulats English Language Test, score 75-89, of University of Cambridge or of Cambridge Assessment English (for certificates that were issued up to 19/11/2019).
5. International English Language Testing System (IELTS) by the University of Cambridge Local Examinations Syndicate (UCLES) or the Cambridge Assessment English – The British Council – IDP Education Australia IELTS Australia with Grading from 7 to 8.
6. Business English Certificate – Higher (BEC Higher) from the University of Cambridge Local Examinations Syndicate (UCLES) or the Cambridge Assessment English or Business English Certificate Higher of the Cambridge Assessment English overall score 180-199.
7. Business English Certificate Vantage of Cambridge Assessment English overall score 180-190.
8. London Tests of English Level 4 -Advanced Communication - by Edexcel or Pearson Test of English General Level 4 -Advanced Communication - by Edexcel or Edexcel Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (CEF C1).
9. Certificate in Integrated Skills in English ISE III of Trinity College London.
10. City & Guilds Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (reading, writing and listening) - Expert - and City & Guilds Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (spoken) - Expert - (To be submitted cumulatively for demonstration of very good knowledge) or City & Guilds Certificate in International ESOL -Expert - and City & Guilds Certificate in International Spoken ESOL -Expert - To be submitted cumulatively for demonstration of very good knowledge).
11. Advanced Level Certificate in English (ALCE) from the Hellenic American University (Manchester, NH -USA) and the Hellenic American Union.
12. Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC), score from 785 to 900 of Educational Testing Service/Chauncey, USA.
13. EDI Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International JETSET Level 6 (CEF C1) or Pearson EDI level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (CEF C1) or Pearson LCCI level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (CEFR C1).

14. Pearson LCCI EFB Level 4 (Modules: Reading, Writing, Listening, Speaking, in case one of the modules is graded "Pass").
15. Pearson LCCI EFB Level 3 (Modules : Reading, Writing, Listening, Speaking, with grade "Distinction" or "Credit").
16. OCNW Certificate in ESOL International at Level 2 (Common European Framework equivalent level C1) (until 31/8/2009).
17. Ascentis Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (CEF C1).
18. ESB Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International All Modes (Council of Europe Level C1).
19. Test of Interactive English, C1 + Level (ACELS).
20. Test of Interactive English, C1 Level (ACELS) or Test of Interactive English, C1 Level (Gatehouse Awards).
21. NOCN Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (C1).
22. AIM Awards Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (C1) (Modules: Listening, Reading, Writing, Speaking).
23. Michigan English Language Assessment Battery (MELAB) score from 91 to 99 of the Cambridge Michigan Language Assessments (CaMLA).
24. MET - Michigan English Test (Sections: Listening, Reading, Speaking) score from 190 to 240 of the Michigan Language Assessment or CAMBRIDGE MICHIGAN LANGUAGE ASSESSMENTS- CaMLA or MET - Michigan English Test (Sections: Listening, Reading or Listening, Reading, Speaking, Writing) score from 64 to 80 of the Michigan Language Assessment.
25. LRN Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (CEF C1).
26. GA Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International – (CEFR: C1) or GA Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (Classic C1).
27. C1 - LanguageCert Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (Listening, Reading, Writing) (Expert C1) and C1 - LanguageCert Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (Speaking) (Expert C1) (To be submitted cumulatively for demonstration of very good knowledge).
28. Open College Network West Midlands Level 2 Certificate in ESOL International (CEFR C1).

Additionally, very good knowledge of the language can be demonstrated by a State language certificate of level C1 (n.).

Finally, proof of knowledge is not required if the degree (recognized by DOATAP) and/or the postgraduate degree (recognized by DOATAP) has been obtained abroad, where the courses are taught in English.
